

ORDINANCE NO. 84-1

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT WITH THE SHERWIN-WILLIAMS COMPANY OR ITS SUCCESSORS OR ASSIGNS PERTAINING TO THE ISSUANCE OF REVENUE BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MADISON TO FINANCE A MANUFACTURING FACILITY WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE COUNTY OF MADISON.

* * * * *

WHEREAS, the County of Madison, Kentucky (herein called the "Issuer"), by virtue of the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, particularly Sections 103.200 to 103.285, inclusive, of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, including amendments thereto, and the authorities therein mentioned, wishes to take the necessary actions for the issuance of revenue bonds in an aggregate principal amount now estimated at approximately \$10,000,000 (the "Bonds") for the purpose of defraying the cost of acquiring, building and equipping real and personal property comprising a project consisting of a manufacturing facility (herein called the "Project") within the boundaries of the Issuer, which project shall be owned by The Sherwin-Williams Company, or its successors and assigns, (herein called the "Company"); and

WHEREAS, the Company is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Ohio and is qualified to do business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF THE COUNTY OF MADISON, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

Section 1


In order to provide funds to defray the cost of the Project, the Fiscal Court of the County of Madison hereby agrees to authorize and issue revenue bonds of the Issuer, upon the general terms provided in the form of Agreement (attached hereto as Exhibit A) by and between the Issuer and the Company. The County Judge - Executive of the County of Madison is hereby authorized and directed to execute such agreement and the Clerk of said County to attest the same substantially in such form with such changes as are not adverse to the Issuer as such officers may approve, such execution being conclusive evidence of approval of any such changes.

Section 2

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon its adoption.

EXHIBIT A

AGREEMENT TO ISSUE BONDS

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into on February __, 1984 between THE COUNTY OF MADISON, KENTUCKY, a county and political subdivision in and of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (hereinafter sometimes called "Issuer") and THE SHERWIN-WILLIAMS COMPANY, or its successors and assigns, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Ohio and duly qualified to do business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky (hereinafter sometimes called "Company"), in furtherance of the public purposes set forth in Kentucky Revised Statutes Sections 103.200 to 103.285, inclusive, as amended;

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, the Company desires to acquire, construct and equip real and personal property comprising a manufacturing facility described in the application attached hereto as Exhibit 1 to be owned by the Company (herein called "Project") within the boundaries of the Issuer; and

WHEREAS, the Company has requested that the Issuer issue revenue bonds in an aggregate principal amount now estimated at approximately \$10,000,000 (herein called "Bonds") to provide funds to defray the cost of the Project, and it is agreeable to make payments to the Issuer sufficient to pay all of the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer is willing to issue the Bonds and desires to obtain the economic benefits from such Project.

W I T N E S S E T H

1. The Company shall commence and continue the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Project as soon as feasible, and the Company will provide, or cause to be provided, at its own expense, the necessary interim financing to permit such equipping and improvement of the Project to commence and continue. Upon the issuance of the Bonds, the Company will enter into an agreement (herein called "Financing Agreement") with respect to the Project and the financing therefor. The Financing Agreement shall be in the form of a loan agreement or such other form as may be permitted under the Kentucky Revised Statutes; provided, however, that the Financing Agreement shall require payments sufficient to pay the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on such Bonds as may be issued with respect to the Project, or portion thereof, which is the subject of such Financing Agreement. In order to secure the payment of the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds, the Issuer shall also enter into a trust agreement, indenture or mortgage. Upon request of the purchaser or purchasers of the Bonds, the Company may give and the Issuer or the trustee designated under such trust agreement or indenture shall, on behalf and for the protection of the holders of the Bonds, accept such other security. The Bonds will be special obligations of the Issuer and neither the Project nor the Bonds will constitute an indebtedness of the

Issuer within the meaning of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

2. Upon receipt of a request from the Company, an opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, and the receipt of any other necessary approvals provided for within the Kentucky Revised Statutes, the Issuer will promptly issue the Bonds, maturing in such amount and times, bearing interest at such rate or rates, payable on such dates and containing such optional and mandatory redemption features and prices as are requested by the Company, and will deliver the Bonds to the purchaser or purchasers thereof and cooperate to its fullest extent in consummating the transaction.

3. In order to induce the Issuer to execute and deliver this Agreement and ultimately to issue the Bonds, the Company shall defend, indemnify and hold the Issuer and any and all officials thereof harmless against any and all loss, cost, expense, claims or actions arising out of or connected with the execution of this Agreement and the preparation of proceedings for, and the issuance, sale or delivery of, the Bonds.

4. If ownership of the Project is at any time vested in the Issuer, appropriate provisions will be made for "in lieu of tax payments," or if the Project is deemed exempt from ad valorem taxes, appropriate provisions will be made for "in lieu of tax payments".

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Issuer, pursuant to an ordinance adopted on February 22, 1984 by its Fiscal Court has caused this Agreement to be executed by its County Judge - Executive and attested to by its Clerk, and the Company has caused it to be executed by a duly authorized representative, all as of the day and year first above written.

MAIN R.R. TRACK

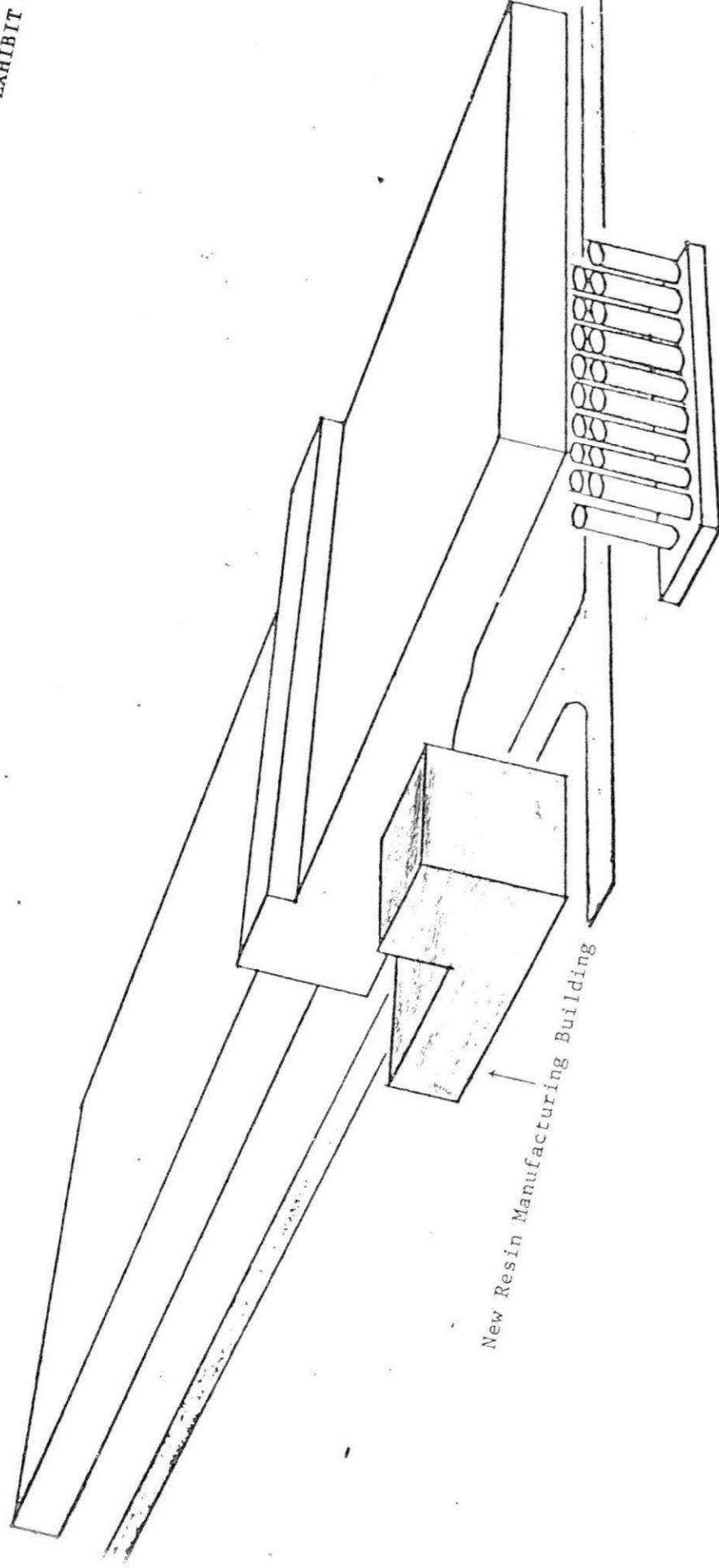


SITE PLAN

This letter is to confirm Robinson-Humphrey's commitment to buy the Industrial Revenue Bonds you intend to issue in conjunction with the construction of your resin plant in Madison County, Kentucky.

It is my understanding that these bonds will have ten to twenty year maturities; but should you change the term, I do not feel that the marketability would be affected for any maturity less than ten years. As you know, the rate will be determined at the time we purchase the bonds. Based on the market today, the rate would be approximately 10% for ten years and 11% for twenty years for bonds rated Baa3.

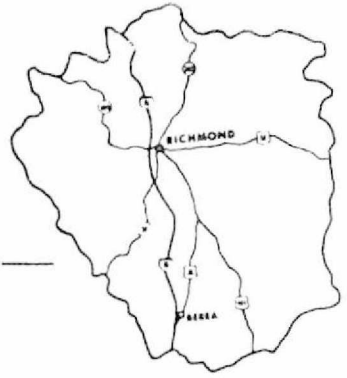

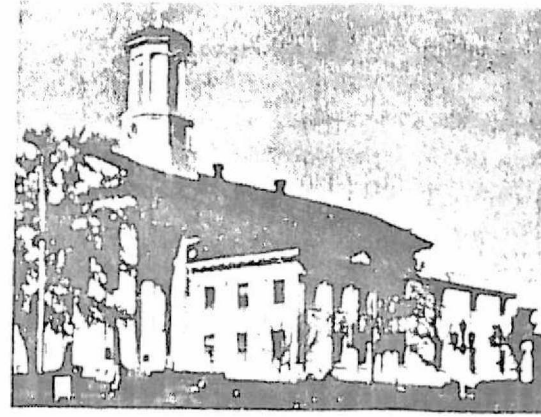


Dear Joan:
