

ORDINACE 99-17

AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING THE SPEED LIMITS
ON COUNTY ROADS

WHEREAS, the Madison County Fiscal Court desires to provide uniform and safe speed limits for travel along all roads in the county of Madison, and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court, pursuant to KRS 189.230, 67.080, and 67.083, may establish by proper order, speed limits on county roads lower than those prescribed by statute, and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Madison County have expressed a desire to post speed limits on county roads, and

WHEREAS, KRS 189.230 empowers the County to change speed limits if in the Judge Executive's judgment, such highway may be damaged or destroyed by motor trucks if the speed limits exceeds certain limits,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COIURT OF THE COUNTY OF MADISON, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY that the following speed limits be adopted for all roads in the county road system.

Subdivision streets and roads have a 25 mile per hour speed limit unless petitioned by the subdivision residents requesting a lower speed limit.

County roads under 20 feet in width have a 35 mile per hour speed limit.

County roads 20 feet or wider have a 45 mile per hour speed limit.
