

ORDINANCE NO. 05-03

Amending Ordinance No.92-07
AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE NUMBERING OF
STRUCTURES IN MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, Madison County, Kentucky, is in need of adequate numbering of household residences, offices, businesses, and other structures, to enhance emergency response; and

WHEREAS, In Madison County, Kentucky there are structures, which include residences, mobile homes, offices, and businesses, that are improperly addressed or identified causing major difficulty for the emergency response personnel to properly locate the physical location of the originating emergency telephone call;

WHEREAS, In Madison County, Kentucky there are numerous roads that are privately owned and maintained with structures located thereon and have structures addressed on the same rendering it extremely difficult for the emergency response personnel to properly locate the physical location of the originating emergency telephone call;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF THE COUNTY OF MADISON, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY.

Addressing of Structures

(a) That all residences, mobile homes, offices, and businesses in Madison County, Kentucky is hereby required to have visible on the structure the numerical address of the structure on the road on which the structure is located as listed by the United States Postal Service and the Madison County Street Addresser;

(b) but, if the structure is more than fifty (50) feet from the roadway (private, county, or state maintained) or from the mailbox, then, the numbered address of the road on which the structure is located shall be posted at the entrance to the property using the fire gates available from the County Addressing Office,

(c) The numbered addresses of each structure shall be displayed with numbers at least three and one-half (3 ½) inches high and one-half (1/2) inch wide.

(d) The numbers shall be displayed so as to be clearly visible from the road on which the structure is located.

(e) The numbers shall be affixed to the structure or to the mailbox or in the absence of a mailbox then upon a fire gates available from the County Addressing Office.

(f) In the case of residences, offices, or buildings having "community mail boxes", it shall not be adequate to display the numbered address on the mailbox. The numbered address must be displayed on the fire gates available from the County Addressing Office.

Private Road Signs

Roads that are privately owned and maintained shall be properly identified in a manner that renders it readily distinguishable as a private road. Road signs for private roads shall have a different appearance than public roads and shall be so designated using the fire gates available from the County Addressing Office. The fire gate shall have the road name placed on it and be positioned in a conspicuous location as you enter the private road. The private road signs are the responsibility of the developer of the road and/or the property owners utilizing the property for their access.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED:

(a) That the owner of each residence, office, or business shall be responsible for placement of each numbered address on their property within sixty (60) days of the passage of this Ordinance or within ten (10) days of new occupancy.

(b) If the numbered address is not properly placed within the aforementioned time period, the County may, in its discretion, place the numbered address on the property and bill the charges to the owner.

THIS ORDINANCE NO. 05-03 SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE ON THE DATE OF ITS SECOND READING AND ADOPTION.


