AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE #01-04 RELATING TO THE CONTROL AND REGULATION OF THE CANINE POPULATION IN MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF MADISON COUNTY, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

WHEREAS, the Madison County Fiscal Court amends Ordinance 01-04, Section 402 to now read:

402. Habitually barks, howls, yelps or whines loud enough to be heard beyond the premises of where it is kept or harbored for a period of thirty (30) minutes consistently.

THIS AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE 01-04 SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE ON THE DATE OF THE SECOND READING AND ADOPTION.

Ordinance #01-04 –Animal Shelter Ordinance

Section 402. Currently Reads

402. Incessantly barks, howls, yelps or whines loud enough to be heard beyond the premises of where it is kept or harbored for a period of one (1) hour continuously.

Proposed Change

402. Habitually barks, howls, yelps or whines loud enough to be heard beyond the premises of where it is kept or harbored for a period of thirty (30) minutes consistently.
